

Myers & Gaudette help Randolph Oilers win again

RANDOLPH - The Randolph Oilers scored three touchdowns within a three-minute second-quarter span Saturday, downing visiting Charlestown in the Eastern Football League, 28-15.

The Oilers improved to 3-6 with its second win in as many weeks.

Running back Frank Gaudette began the scoring binge on a 3-yard touchdown run with 5:15 to go in the first half.

After Charles Williams recovered a fumble on the ensuing kickoff, quarterback Ryan Meyers connected with McKenzie Harrison on a 35-yard pass in putting Randolph ahead, 14-3.

A Kevin Callahan fumble recovery and 23-yard return then put the Oilers at Charlestown's 8-yard line. Meyers hit Williams on a 3-yard pass, widening the Randolph edge with 2:15 left in the first half.

Meyers finished 8-for-19 with three touchdowns and one interception. Gaudette was the team's leading rusher, going for 51 yards on 13 carries.

Randolph will play its final home game of the season Saturday when it hosts Middlesex at 7 p.m at Randolph High School.
